And speaking of full circle, you and I had blast working on FLY BY NIGHT at Playwright's, didn't we?

CANTOR

We absolutely did! You have quite a history of working alongside exceptional women, don't you, Sam?

PINKLETON

That and building a body of work I'm proud to have been a part of. Tonight we're reminded that the spine of the Foundation rests on legacy and the commitment of the artists who have dedicated their lives to their craft. The awards that are given tonight are not just bestowed upon the most qualified recipient, nor generically given for outstanding work.

CANTOR

They are given in the name of an individual who has made a difference to the artistic community: Joe A. Callaway, Zelda Fichandler, as are our additional awards named after: George C. Abbott (Mr. Abbott) and Gordon Davidson. All people who forged paths that left specific legacies that were instrumental to the development of their artistic communities. The Foundation also has *Fellowships* that are named after people: Mike Ockrent, The Chuck Abbott, Shepard and Mildred Traube, and Gielgud Fellowships. Talking about Susan's accomplishments in a room full of her peers here tonight is a bit like touting Meryl Streep at the Academy Awards. We all know your work, your talent, your tenacity, know your gift. And you deserve every single accolade you've received... which, by the way, there is no shortage of. Need I spell it out? Five time Tony Winner (Crazy for You, Showboat, The Producers, and Contact), to say nothing of your countless nominations and wins for Outer Critics Circle Awards, Drama Desks, Oliviers, and Astaire Awards. And then there's the occasional Life Time Achievement awards you are stacking up: the New Dramatists and The Oscar Hammerstein she'll receive from the York Theatre tomorrow evening.
